## 4. Growing in God Together

For 2023 and 2024 the PCCs of our Benefice have used six themes from Acts 2 as the plan for the year.

In Acts 2 (verses 42-47) we hear about the early church and how they lived and ordered their community, and six themes emerge. Each PCC has chosen Just One Thing to aim for under each of those six themes in the coming year.

The themes are: worship, serving, prayer, outreach, fellowship, learning.

You can ask the PCC members to tell you what they are doing under each theme and see if they can tell you!

It seemed a good idea to focus on these six themes more deeply together, so we have decided to take each one of the themes and use it as the basis of what we are thinking and praying about for 6-8 weeks each over the coming year.

For each theme we will simply slant what we are doing in that direction – the benefice services will specifically focus on the theme, but you may find it cropping up in sermons or prayers, in groups or on our weekly email.

The six overarching themes will appear approximately as follows (though they may start early or finish late):

- Worship giving God our praise
  7 April 12 May
- Fellowship our relationships in the Body of Christ
   June - 14 July
- 3. **Prayer** our relationship with God August



- Outreach witnessing to Christ in the world 8 September - 8 October
- Serving others in our community 13 October - 17 November
- Learning growing in knowledge and love of God Early next year – dates to be finalised.

We hope this will be helpful for us in our churches and in our benefice as we pray, minister and worship together.

### • Prayers of Love and Faith - a message from Debbie

Many of you will know that the C of E has had an extended period of discussion and discernment regarding same sex relationship and how we, as a church, might respond.

At present Synod has agreed that churches are able to bless a same-sex relationship within the context of a normal service of worship.

The Prayers of Love and Faith are designed for use with same-sex couples who are in stable, permanent, faithful, exclusive relationships - not necessarily just civil partnerships or marriages (i.e. these are not just intended as blessings for legally recognised relationships)

Services including Prayers of Love and Faith must not be made to look like a marriage service. These prayers are not a marriage equivalent.

As a Benefice we need to consider our local response to all this. The PCCs have begun a discussion, and I am keen to hear from anyone with views (for or against) so that we can come to a good decision based on moving together.

So just to be clear – this is not a stand-alone service, it is blessing a couple in another service. Of course, if we were to be doing such a blessing we would signal well in advance so that people knew what was going to happen when. Please do tell Debbie or Shirley what you think if you would like to.
