2. Vergers needed at St Sampson's - can you help?

Since the start of Covid in 2020 Barry Hammond has been our primary verger at St Sampson's and he has performed sterling work for which we are really grateful. However, with Christmas approaching and all the extra work that entails for him as Buildings Manager he isn't able to verge for us for the rest of the year. We are now looking for 2-3 people to help.

- The role of verger is a vital one:
 - A chance to offer the ministry of welcome to people who do not normally come to church.
 - A moment when you can be the public face of our loving church.

- A chance to stand alongside those who are bereaved.
- A ministry of helping so that the people taking services don't have to think of all the practical things as well as take the service.
- A chance to share God's love at important moments in people's lives.

However, being a verger needn't be too onerous! Most of the practical duties involve preparing for and clearing up after weddings and funerals and running the sound system during the proceedings (for which you will be fully trained). As it happens there are no more weddings this year. Funerals are ad hoc and we do get 2-3 weeks' notice of dates and times. There is a small fee of £40 per funeral and £50 per wedding for officiating.
